PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Parents, Families and Friends,

Last week our Reconciliation sacrament candidates began their preparations. Fittingly, the Gospel this Sunday calls us to love our enemies. Perhaps one of the most difficult lessons to learn is forgiveness of those whom we consider our enemies, those who have wronged us. As challenging as this may be, the Gospel calls us to a very high standard: we must be merciful as God is merciful. How would life be different if there was no judging or condemning of others – if everyone was forgiven and treated well? We wish our sacramental candidates the best as they continue to prepare for their first Rite of Reconciliation.

On Monday, further Rapid Antigen tests (RATs) were sent home with children and we appreciate the efforts families are making to test twice a week supporting the safety of everyone. We are grateful that we have had minimal disruptions due to COVID since the beginning of the year and will continue to follow government and CES directives.

We are now in a position where we can welcome vaccinated parents on site. Parents are more than welcome to join us for the morning Community Reading session from 8:45am each day and are also able to enter the school grounds from 3pm to sit in the shade (and air conditioning once the Convent is finished) and connect as a community whilst waiting for school to finish. You can choose to pick your child up from the school grounds


CAN YOU HELP?

CODE RED FIRE DAY PROCEDURES:

Fire danger ratings and warnings are used in Victoria to provide clear direction on the safest options for preserving life.

Schools and children's services listed on the DET Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) will be closed when a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined in their Bureau of Meteorology district. Our school has been identified as being one of those at high bushfire risk and is listed on the BARR.



Where possible, we will provide parents with up to four days notice of a potential Code Red day closure by letter and SMS message. A Code Red day will be determined by the Emergency Management Commissioner no later than 1.00 pm the day before the potential closure. Once we are advised of the confirmation of the Code Red day we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast.

This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to note that:

- No staff will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Code Red day.
- School camps will be cancelled if a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined for the Bureau of Meteorology district in which the camp is located.

On these Code Red days families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan – on such days children should never be left at home or in the care of older children.

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the CFA advise that when Code Red days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Code Red day.

As part of preparing our school for potential hazards such as fire, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan.

What can parents do?

- Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event that our school is closed.
- Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers. Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters, by talking to your child's teacher or any other member of the teaching staff about our emergency management plan.
- Most importantly at this time of year, if you're planning a holiday or short stay in the bush or in a coastal area, you should check warnings in advance of travel and remain vigilant during your stay.
- If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.

CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS

In order to prepare for the language & learning demands of the school environment, children need ample time and opportunity to engage in meaningful interactions with their family.



Receptive Language (Language Comprehension)

Receptive language, or “what goes in”, is the ability to understand what people are saying. This includes individual words as well as the sentence type/ structure. Receptive language skills underpin all areas of the school curriculum including literacy, numeracy and social and personal capabilities.

Activities:

7. Word associations

Here is an easy game to play in the car that will help your child make connections between words..

An object is named and then the next person must supply another word that is associated or related to it in some way – that is, it has a common attribute. Players continue adding more words until play stalls, or a word is repeated. It is up to the person who gave a word to explain why it was included, if others do not understand.

E.g. Tree – branch - leaves – grass (both green) – flowers (both grow)...

We are excited to announce that the Parents & Friends group will be having a refresh in 2022.


