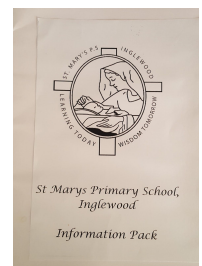

Parent: "What did you do today?" **Child:** "Nothing".

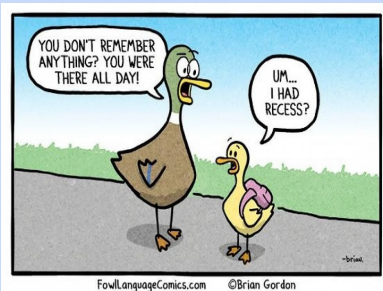
(End of conversation!)

In this program, you will find out how to help your child understand and manage feelings such as worry, frustration and anger.

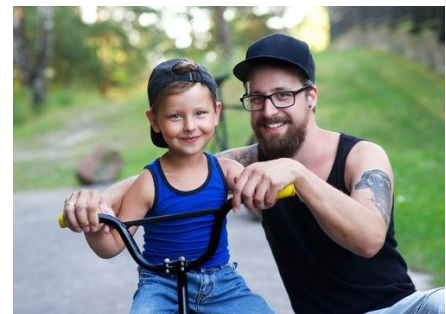
