



### CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS

In order to prepare for the language & learning demands of the school environment, children need ample time and opportunity to engage in meaningful interactions with their family.



### Receptive Language (Language Comprehension)

Receptive language, or "what goes in", is the ability to understand what people are saying. This includes individual words as well as the sentence type/ structure. Receptive language skills underpin all areas of the school curriculum including literacy, numeracy and social and personal capabilities.

### Activities:

#### 3. Background knowledge

Get your child 'warmed- up' for a particular activity or conversation topic by activating their background knowledge. This will help them make connections with new knowledge and help to get it into their long- term memory.

Get your child to tell you words related to the upcoming activity/ topic/ book. Use the following colourful semantics cards as prompts:



Example: Going to Grandma's house

Who will be there: Grandma, maybe Uncle Jim, our family, we might see the neighbour Denise.

Where: Birchip, north of here, Grandma's house, backyard, Happy Street.

When: for the weekend

What doing words: Grandma might be cooking, play cricket in the backyard, talking, driving

What like (describing words): The drive will be long and boring, it will be hot, Grandma's house is old, cluttered, cracked paths.







Dear Parents & Guardians,

As you are aware, throughout 2021 St Mary's Primary School has been participating in a review of our Bridgewater private bus service. The review, undertaken by Catholic Education Sandhurst Ltd., considered the community, financial, staffing and risk implications of this service.

A presentation entitled *Bus Service Feasibility Report* was given to the St Mary's Primary School Inglewood: School Advisory Council on Monday 23rd August 2021 by Ashley Marsh, Catholic Education Sandhurst - Principal Consultant: Primary (Western Deanery).

Following this presentation, an additional briefing paper considering more detailed financial implications of the bus service was presented and discussed at the School Advisory Council meeting on Monday 18th October.

Following this meeting, the decision has been made that St Mary's Primary School will cease the Bridgewater private bus service at the conclusion of the 2021 school year and the bus asset sold.

I welcome the opportunity to work with the school community to seek alternative means of transportation for current and future students who would have utilised the bus service and encourage suggestions and conversations with families.

I would like to formally thank Micah Hodge, who has undertaken the role of School Services Officer (Bus Driver) since November 2020. I would also like to thank the St Mary's school community for their support of the bus service since its commencement in 2019.

## Standard process for Positive COVID cases on the school site:

The CECV has been working with the Department of Education and Training and the Department of Health (DH) to revise and streamline how COVID-19 cases will be managed in schools.

As a school community, we need to be mindful and respectful of the privacy of any families who have tested positive to COVID-19.

#### The revised process is set out below:

As soon as a school becomes aware that a person who was onsite has tested positive to COVID-19, but only where the case was onsite within 48 hours prior to the onset of symptoms consistent with COVID-19, the following process would be enacted;

- 1. The school may be required to close for an initial period of time to allow for identification and notification of primary close contacts (PCCs). This will be done in consultation with Catholic Education Sandhurst.
- 2. The Principal will ensure that a spreadsheet (supplied by CES) is completed to identify Primary Close Contacts. This is forwarded to the relevant local public health unit of the Department of Health.
- 3. The Principal will then ensure that the identified PCCs are contacted with instructions that PCCs should stay at home and get tested as soon as possible.
- 4. Schools/Principals will use mud maps to analyse possible high-risk zones which may be contaminated following access by a confirmed Covid Case. Identified contaminated areas will be isolated until cleaning is completed.
- 5. Schools/Principals will contact their cleaning contractors after any contaminated areas have been identified as requiring additional cleaning.
- 6. The Department of Health will send an SMS to the Primary Close Contacts advising them of their quarantine, testing and release dates (this may take some days).
- 7. Primary school student PCCs will be asked to isolate until they clear a Day 13 test.
- 8. Adult PCCs will be informed that if they are vaccinated, they should isolate for seven days and may be able to return to school after a Day 6 test, depending on local school arrangements. If the adult PCCs are unvaccinated, they will be required to isolate for 14 days and can return to school after a Day 13 test.
- 9. Families/households of PCCs will no longer be required to limit their movements or stay at home.
- 10. When any necessary cleaning has been arranged and PCCs identified and contacted, schools will then notify all other students they should return to school the following day. The school can reopen the following day without requiring further notification.

#### Please note:

Schools are not required to report confirmed positive cases of school community members if those individuals were not onsite in the 48 hours prior to the onset of symptoms consistent with COVID-19. There is no action required by the school in this situation.
