



EVERY CHILD READING	Daily Community Reading Time: Each morning, the bell will ring at <u>8:45am</u> to signal the start of our morning Community Reading time. Whenever possible, parents are asked to join us for our Community Reading sessions and listen to your child read. There will be staff available to listen to children read on days when parents/guardians are unable to come in.
	Literacy Support: In 2022, classes will have additional literacy support in the classroom, with most literacy sessions having two adults present supporting children.
	Professional Learning: Teaching staff will be undertaking a six week professional learning masterclass based on the Science of Learning, Reading and Writing.

	Community Reading: Families will have the opportunity to connect with each other and the school during our Community Reading Time.

SAFE ON SOCIAL - SCHOOLS TOOLKIT:

This week we received an interesting email from the Safe on Social team...

"Like my daughter's school, you probably have visitors on-site during any given week. Parents, casual teachers, presenters to name a few.

The majority of these visitors will have mobile phones. Many of them will take photos or video footage while they are visiting. A lot of them will post these online or on social media. And maybe you sometimes do the same?



Well, there are some important guidelines you need to be aware of to protect you, your students and your school from serious legal issues pertaining to the taking and use of photos or videos on school premises:

- Parents and third-party contractors ARE NOT AUTHORISED to use or post images on social media without specific permissions being signed by every single person (or parent of) that appears within an image being used.
- Posting photos or videos of some students online can have serious repercussions for their privacy and safety. Domestic violence, custody issues, and in more extreme cases, witness protection situations, can negatively affect many students, and aspects like their location, school, and who they interact with needs to remain private.

• Students must be regularly reminded that taking photos of their friends at school and then posting them to social media platforms like Facebook, Instagram, and SnapChat is classified as publishing without consent. This can cause issues for your school from a duty of care perspective if the students in the photo are in school uniform, on school grounds or on an excursion.

CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS

In order to prepare for the language & learning demands of the school environment, children need ample time and opportunity to engage in meaningful interactions with their family.



Receptive Language (Language Comprehension)

Receptive language, or "what goes in", is the ability to understand what people are saying. This includes individual words as well as the sentence type/ structure. Receptive language skills underpin all areas of the school curriculum including literacy, numeracy and social and personal capabilities.

Activities:

6. Understanding instructions

Assist your child to understand instructions by using actual objects or gesture. Here are some ideas:

- · Point to your shoes when you are asking your child to get their shoes,
- · Gesture with your hands for concepts like under, first,
- Point in the direction of Grandma's house,
- Point to your watch if you are telling your child to hurry up.

In addition to this, teach your child to repeat instructions back to themselves to support comprehension. Model this self- talk yourself and prompt your child to do the same by asking, 'Now tell me, what do you have to do?'.
