

May we wish to be grafted onto the ancient heritage, so that its


life may flow through us.





Enrolments for 2021





ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Tips for parents to help your child's attendance at school.

Talk to your child about how important their education is and how it will help them with their future ambitions. If they see that you value their education they too will see the value.

Always speak positively about teachers, school and education.

Don't give your child the choice of going to school, there is no choice, it is a legal requirement.



Set a good example yourself, show your children how you keep to your own commitments.

Make a technology cut off time at night, where technology is handed over to you at a nominated time each night and keep technology out of their bedrooms.

Make sure your children are getting enough sleep and waking in the morning with enough time to get dressed, have breakfast and brush their teeth. Rushed routines in the morning really won't help you or your child.

Get your child to pack their school bag and have their school uniform ready the night before.

Encourage them to take up hobbies that they enjoy such as different sports and clubs. This will help them develop positive relationships outside of school.

Encourage your child to walk to school with a friend.

Keep track of your child's absences from school, and always call the Office to notify us of your child's absence.
