
Your hard work and dedication was evident throughout the year as was your commitment towards being student-centred and improving student outcomes. Our school community is lucky to have you working with us.


Prepare Ye!

CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS

In order to prepare for the language & learning demands of the school environment, children need ample time and opportunity to engage in meaningful interactions with their family.



Expressive Language

We speak and write for many reasons; To tell a story, to recount an event, to question, to argue, to socialise, to describe etc. Children need to develop the skills to communicate for a wide range of purposes, verbally and in their writing, in order to succeed in life.

Activities:

10. Take a photo from an outing – a holiday, the park, a takeaway shop. Use this as the beginning of a story. E.g. One hot summer's day my family went to the swimming pool. Use the trigger sentence – "Then all of a sudden..." Get your child to think of silly problems and events that might happen in the story. You can make it as humorous or as far- fetched as you like, most importantly it has to be fun! Make sure you include the following important parts;

The setting, a problem which arises in the story or a kick off event

Feelings: how the character feels about the problem,

A plan: action and solution to the problem,

And an ending.


