


CATHOLIC IDENTITY

Next week, we invite you to St Mary's Primary for Shrove Tuesday Breakfast and Ash Wednesday Mass. Shrove Tuesday marks the last day before the start of Lent (Ash Wednesday). Traditionally, this day would be a chance to attend confession and consume foods which would go off during the abstinence period of Lent. Many households would consume their eggs, milk, butter, and fat which were turned into pancakes. **St Mary's school will be hosting a pancake breakfast from 8:30-9:00am with the assistance of the student leadership group. At 9:15 the school will be hosting our first assembly for the year.** Please support our students whilst they receive class and school awards.

The following day, we invite our community members to join us at Mass in St Mary's Church for Ash Wednesday. Being the first day of the Christian season of Lent, the marking of the Ashes on Ash Wednesday is an expression of our faith and a sign that we are asking God for forgiveness. The ashes are made from the blessed palms used in the Palm Sunday celebration of the previous year. The ashes are christened with Holy Water and are scented by exposure to incense. The priest or adult will mark a cross on the forehead of the recipient stating, "Turn away from Sin and be faithful to the Gospel".




Sacramental Program - Fr Stephen

3.14 Photography or videos/recordings/films by parents/carers/guardians






Visual Arts

Prep-Grade 3: We started off the year in Visual Arts looking at the Elements of Art and learning about the colour wheel. Students created their own colour wheel by mixing primary colours together to make secondary colours and then collected materials from the school yard in the colours on our wheel to add to their work. We have also been looking at colour by studying Joan Miro's "Sun Eater" artwork and students have begun to re-create their own versions of this piece. We will continue to work on our "Sun Eater" pieces over the coming weeks and include some photos of these in upcoming newsletters.

Grade 4-6: Students were very enthusiastic to learn about graffiti and street art so we've been studying the history of these art forms and beginning to create our own graffiti pieces on paper with our initials. Students have explored different terms used in street art and graffiti including "tags", "throws" and "pieces" and have learnt about the use of colour and line when forming their work. It's been terrific to see the students so engaged in creating their pieces and demonstrating their understanding of the differences between vandalism and art. As we have learnt while studying this unit, the term "art" is certainly subjective and what appeals to some, may not to others.

Performing Arts- Dance

Over the past few weeks students have been learning about the evolution of dance through the ages with us learning about some history of the 1920s and 1930s and the popular dances at those times, including "The Charleston" and "Ballin the Jack". Students noticed that most of the dances during this time were all about the movement of the feet, sometimes really fast and energetically! They made connections with dance steps popular 100 years ago which have been adapted into dance moves which are popular today and learnt about how dance is a reflection of important events happening at that time in history. Over the coming weeks we'll continue to look at different decades and the dances which were popular then. We have also had fun singing along to some songs while Mrs Bannan plays the guitar.

School Uniforms

CODE RED FIRE DAY PROCEDURES:

Fire danger ratings and warnings are used in Victoria to provide clear direction on the safest options for preserving life.

Schools and children's services listed on the DET Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) will be closed when a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined in their Bureau of Meteorology district. Our school has been identified as being one of those at high bushfire risk and is listed on the BARR.

Where possible, we will provide parents with up to four days notice of a potential Code Red day closure by letter and SMS message. A Code Red day will be determined by the Emergency Management Commissioner no later than 1.00 pm the day before the potential closure. Once we are advised of the confirmation of the Code Red day we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day.



Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to note that:

- No staff will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Code Red day.
- School camps will be cancelled if a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined for the Bureau of Meteorology district in which the camp is located.

On these Code Red days families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan – on such days children should never be left at home or in the care of older children.

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the CFA advise that when Code Red days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Code Red day.

As part of preparing our school for potential hazards such as fire, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan.

What can parents do?

- Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event that our school is closed.
- Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers. Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters, by talking to your child's teacher or any other member of the teaching staff about our emergency management plan.
- Most importantly at this time of year, if you're planning a holiday or short stay in the bush or in a coastal area, you should check warnings in advance of travel and remain vigilant during your stay.
- If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.
