Gospel: John 9:1-41





What do you like about St Mary's?: All of the staff and students care about each other and their community. The Coffey family have attended school here since 1957 as have my 3 children





Peer mediation is a powerful method for teaching negotiation and understanding of differences without the need for an authority figure to provide a solution.
