PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Parents, Families and Friends,

Last week, we came together as a school and parish community to celebrate Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday Mass. On Tuesday, the Grade 6's assisted staff with providing the school community with pancakes. As discussed in my previous address, Ash Wednesday is the first day of the Christian season of Lent. It is a time of prayer, fasting and giving to others (almsgiving). Through prayer, we come closer to God so that we are better able to realise our baptismal promise to live justly as Jesus teaches us. Fasting joins us in solidarity with the poor who often have no choice but to go without basic needs. Almsgiving is a sign of our commitment to justice and to follow Christ's mission. As we enter into our second week of Lent, we are reminded to place our thoughts with others and to serve those in need.

This week's Gospel from Matthew 17:1-9, refers to the transfiguration when Jesus took his disciples to the mountain where Moses and Elijah appeared. We are reminded here how Jesus is showing his disciples that he is the divine prophet and the Son of God, in order to strengthen their faith for what is to come.

On Thursday 9th March St Mary's will hold our first school closure day. All staff will be attending a professional development day including a combination of faith formation and professional learning. Teachers will be enriched by unpacking the Gospel of Matthew along with developing units of work using best practice pedagogy.

Years 3 and 5 students will be taking part in the National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) from March 15th. Participating students will complete assessments for Writing, Reading, Language Conventions and Numeracy. Although we do not teach to the tests, we do prepare students to allow for greater success on the day.

Personally, I would like to thank the McLean-Hecker and Ngo families for their time here at St Mary's as they relocate from Inglewood. We pray Ciara, Suzie and Huy enjoy their settings and welcome them back next time they visit Inglewood.

Child Safety

New Child Safe standards now apply in Victoria to better protect our children and young people. Throughout the year I will be introducing and explaining what these standards mean in regard to our school procedures which we implement to keep our students safe.

Child Safe Standard 9 - Child safety in physical and online environments.

Physical and online environments promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for children and young people to be harmed.

—Student Pick-Up Arrangements—

A reminder of the importance of communicating **with the school directly**, about who your child is to be picked up by at the end of the school day. If your usual arrangements are changing, we ask you to inform the office of the new plan, rather than letting your child or another parent inform us. We have had situations where students have thought they were being picked up by someone else, but plans had changed during the day. With our swimming and gym program, we also need you to **ring the school** if you are collecting your child early from these locations, as they need to be marked off on the electronic attendance roll.

Cyber Safety Evening

A big thanks to those families who attended our Cyber Safety evening conducted by Grant Fitzgerald from Catholic Education Sandhurst. As stated in Child Safe Standard 9 it is all of our duty of care to promote safe online practices, and your attendance at these evenings reinforces for the children the importance of these messages in both the school and home environment.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

if you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
