PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Parents, Families and Friends,

Welcome back for another term. I trust you all enjoyed the holidays and spent valuable time with family and friends. It was great to see the students back last week and listen to all their adventures. We have certainly hit the ground running for Term 3, as we conducted our Learning Conversations this week. Students led these conversations and were able to articulate their goals and share some learning samples that they were proud of. We won't be hosting Learning Conversations again until the back end of Term 4, however, we do encourage regular contact with your child's classroom teacher.

Last week, Cath Williams and I attended a two-day conference around the use of data, hosted by Dr Seena Fisk. During the two days, Selena worked with school leaders in the Sandhurst Diocese to develop strategic approaches to the data schools collect, collate and use, so we can hold highly effective conversations to ensure our decisions being made are informed by evidence. Using feedback data from our NSIT Review in Term One,



we have created the goal of 'Developing a school-wide approach to the use of analysis of data to underpin improvement strategies.' The school is in the process of developing our Strategic Plan for 2024-2026, which will be heavily focused on continuing to strive to embed evidence-based and best practices at St Mary's. We are using data from our School NSIT Review, evidence based pedagogy, along with students & families, staff and members of Catholic Education Sandhurst Ltd. The strategic plan will be discussed with the St Mary's Advisory Council and will be presented to the community in Term 4.




Matthew 13:24-43



Refugee Week




